

English – Writing lists


We write lists for lots of different things.

Shopping lists, a list of people to invite to our party, birthday and Christmas list or a list of jobs we need to do.


<u>Choose from these activities or do all of them – first look at the writing lists worksheets.</u>


- Can you help your family to write a shopping list? Check the fridge and cupboards to check what you need and make a list.

- Can you count how many items you found for each letter? Which letter had the most food items? Which letter had the least food items?

Download the writing frames that you want to use.














Sound walk
