Activity: Stardust: Make you very own magical sparkly star dust. Use your senses to think of words to describe how this smells, looks, sounds. Download the instructions.


**Craft:** Can you make constellations from mini marshmallows, twiglets/pretzel sticks or spaghetti.


## How does our body work?


Go outside and use chalk to draw around someone's body.


Can you draw what is inside your body?














## **Potion making!!**
