





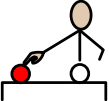
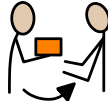
















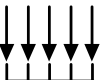



 **Rice**  **and**  **Ice**  **Sensory**  **Activity:**

This is a  fun  activity  that  provides  an  opportunity  to  play  with  rhyming  words,

 explore  scientific  concepts  and  learn  about  primary colour  mixing  with  all  the  benefits

 of sensory play.



What you will need:

*Two ice cube tray,



*Water,



+



*Yellow and blue food colouring,



*Large tray

*1 cup of dry uncooked rice.





Suggestion activities:



1. Talk about the rhyming words rice and ice: can you think of another word that



rhymes with rice and ice? Words such as mice, nice and so on.



You may like to try and write these words in the wet rice on the tray.




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


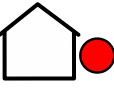









2. Talk to your adult about the two different coloured ice blocks. What will happen when the



colours mix?

3.  Sort the coloured  ice  into groups  according to colour 

4.  Line all the ice  blocks  up  around the  outside of the  tray.  Try  to build  and  stack

 with the  ice  blocks.

 Adults  could  ask questions like..  *Why is water  changing  colour?  *What is happening to the

 rice?  *What colours  can  you  see?  I can  see...  *Why is the ice  getting smaller?
