What is good about this resources is for each activity there is a multi-sensory approach given for each activity. Here is an example from the Adventure in Space!

### Multi sensory: *Metallic sounds*

- *Offer keys or other suspended metal objects, use a wind chime if you have one*
- *Place at your child's hand level and see if they can reach out to make a sound*
- *Find some metal bowls and place metal utensils and cutlery in to mix around with hands, feet or a spoon*
- *Tap metal bowls with your fingers or wooden spoons and listen to long otherworldly metal sounds*
- *Leave lots of silence before and after sounds*
- *See if you can place these sounds in the spaces provided on the backing track*

Within the site is mentioned the music app Clarion™. This app has been developed for people who find conventional instruments inaccessible. It works on iPad, Windows and Eyegaze computers and can be played with any part of the body.
