The Lifeguards use special flags on the beaches to

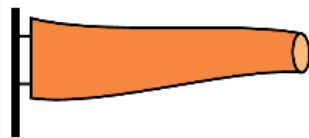


show people if it is safe to go in the sea.



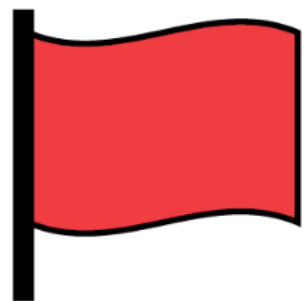
