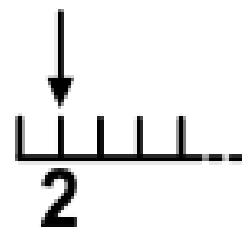


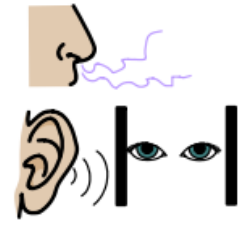

Be a Toy Rescuer!

Sensory benefits: tactile, visual; motor planning, fine motor, social-emotional skills

What you need:

- A selection of small world toys – dinosaurs, animals, cars, people..... whatever you can find
- A tray, plastic lid or board that is ok to stick tape on. Could be a wall if you're ok with that.
- Selection of sticky tapes - masking tape, parcel tape, gaffer tape, insulation tape (the stickier the trickier!)

What to do:

- Prepare the board/tray by sticking the toys down with the tape in a random way all over the board.
- Ask your child to help rescue the toys by using their fingers to peel off the tape

Make it trickier!

- Really sticky tape
- Set a timer to beat – how many toys can you rescue in a minute?

Alternative:

- No need for a board. Just wrap the toy in masking tape and get your child to peel it off to rescue the toy.
- Make it into a scavenger hunt around the house. Have clues to first find the toys then rescue them before they get the next clue.
