| Number / shape activity | Make a collection of circular objects. Explore their shape and what you can do with them. Do they roll? spin? stack? |
| Sensory play | If you have any egg boxes, put them in a tray with some dry sensory materials such as rice/lentils/cereals. Add different sized spoons to scoop and fill the egg boxes with. (teaspoons — tablespoons — large serving spoons) |
| Physical Development (Gross or Fine Motor) | Build a track to roll a ball along. (Think giant marble run!). Go as big as you can — What can you use to roll a football down? Follow lines in different directions. You could do this on a large or small scale. |
| | E.g. use chalks on the floor and walk along the line. Trace along the chalk line using a paintbrush dipped in water. |
| | Use pre writing patterns to trace over using pens or pencils. (See separate document linked on the website page) |
| Creative activity | Make your own Peely Wally bird picture. Use paint or crayons to make a coloured 'splodge' on the paper. Stick on some eyes, legs and a beak. |
| | On an egg shaped piece of paper, use items from around the house to print coloured spots — e.g. corks, bottle lids, toilet roll tubes etc. |
