<p><b>Objectives in spending PPG:</b></p> <p>To meet the individual needs of students through tailored support programmes and additional therapies as identified through the person centred planning and review process. To monitor the spending of funding to ensure that there is equitable provision and funding is correctly targeted to enable pupils' maximum access to learning.</p>
<p><b>Summary of spending and actions taken for 2015-2016 academic year:</b></p> <p><b>Pupil Premium Funding : £ 49,581.98</b></p> <p>There is a cycle of continuous gathering of assessment data and review of spend against pupil outcomes. We ensure that interventions and support are targeted where needed and respond to the needs of the pupils.</p> <p>There has been additional support staffing funded in key stage 3 to enable small group teaching and also work experience opportunities off site. School activities and opportunities have been monitored to ensure priority access to this vulnerable group.</p> <p><b>Trips and Activities (Residentials, Horse Riding,)</b> to enable pupils to expand their learning outside the classroom environment</p> <p><b>Advocacy:</b> ensuring that we have systemic advocacy in place and interventions are driven by pupil voice</p> <p><b>Behaviour Support :</b> establish behaviour support plans</p> <p><b>Individual Music Therapy</b> sessions to support pupil's communication, social skills, boost confidence and increase wellbeing</p> <p><b>Riding for the Disabled</b> therapy sessions to provide physiotherapy and boost physical and mental wellbeing</p> <p><b>Individualised spend</b> e.g. enrichment activities where this will support the pupils' learning</p> <p><b>Aromatherapy :</b> to enhance pupils emotional and physical well being to support their being able to access learning</p> <p><b>Sports Premium Funding: £8240</b> additional hours for a higher level teaching assistant to provide PE and swimming sessions and purchase new gym equipment and expert advice on suitable programmes for pupils</p>

**Yr 7 Literacy Catch Up: £3000** additional staffing for KS3 which provided opportunities to work in smaller groups and access more focussed learning activities targeted at those most in need.

**Outcomes to date:**

Students receiving pupil premium funding have made good progress and have had full access to the curriculum offer. Pupil premium funding has enabled some students to attend residential, who would otherwise have been unable to participate.

**Planned spending and actions for 2016-2017 academic year:**

To continue a cycle of closely monitoring and challenging analysis of data to identify any achievement gaps and to ensure provision of correctly targeted support.

Therapies and interventions will continue to be offered as they have for the 2015-2016 year in order to maximise outcomes for students.
