

ENABLING

A polite reminder that although the school holds a list of staff who are willing to provide an enabling service, school is not responsible for these staff or any arrangements that are made. Enabling is a private and separate agreement between families and whoever is carrying out the enabling.

Please also note that the DBS checks we undertake as a school cover the staff for the work carried out whilst in our employment only. Families will also need to consider Public Liability insurance for enabling work. Thank you.

USING THE HYDROPOOL AT ELLEN TINKHAM

Important = Please note that if your child wears incontinence pads whilst at school, they are required to wear incontinence swimwear in our hydro pool as part of the school's Hydrotherapy Pool policy.

You can purchase incontinence swimwear from a company called HighLine Swimwear which can be found on two websites: [Fledglings](#) and [Respond](#). There are also other brands of incontinence swimwear available - just type in "incontinence swimwear" into your online search engine.

Students can wear swim nappies as an alternative, but swim nappies are not required if your child is already wearing incontinence swimwear. Any queries, please contact your teacher. Thank you for your continued support.
