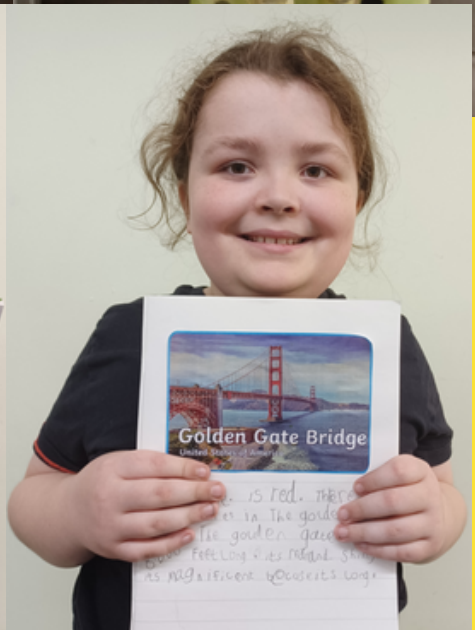
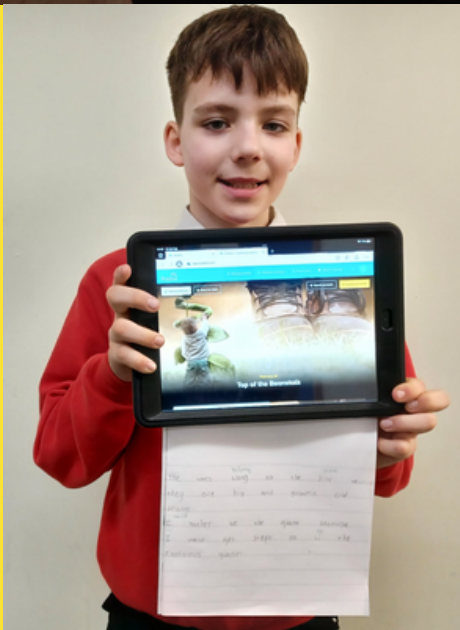

Spring Term 2023 Update from Steven Finnemore, Chair of Governors



Over the last few months there have been a number of changes to the Governing Body, with several Governors retiring and Steve Cleverly, who was the Chair for a number of years and I swapping roles from the 1st of January 2023.

I've spent the Spring Term meeting staff and students across the Federation, listening to both the positives and negatives, and seeing if there is anything we can do in the short and long terms. Staffing levels, capacity/premises, and budget remain the key concerns and Governors want to sincerely thank staff for their commitment and flexibility.

Governors have been busy over the last term working with Nikki Burroughs, Anne Davies and the remaining Senior Leadership Team to make sure the Federation is on a sound footing as we go into the next financial year.

We were shortlisted in our application to have the Ellen Tinkham School Hollow Lane site rebuilt as part of the DfE Rebuilding Schools Programme; sadly, our bid was unsuccessful on this occasion, but we will try again when we can.

Congratulations to Kate Bromage on being the successful candidate for the role of Head of School at Bidwell Brook, in what was a strong field of candidates. Kate was previously Deputy Head working across the Federation, and has already moved to her new role at Bidwell Brook.

Governors have undertaken a number of Monitoring Walks throughout the term, allowing us to monitor and appraise the teaching and learning that goes on in the schools. They are also an opportunity to meet with staff and pupils, and look at any premises issues. We have also attended the careers day at Ellen Tinkham College and Student Councils across the Federation.

The careers day was very well attended and had a real buzz to it. It was great to see the students and parents engaging with the people manning the stands. We would like to thank both Monika Davis and Ed Rice for all the work that they put into organising and hosting the event.

I attended two of the Student Councils and as usual the meetings were fun and constructive. It was great to see the students discussing things that have an impact on them. I gave my commitment that I and other Governors will regularly attend their meetings and will feedback to them should they raise anything during the meeting.

The retirement of several long serving Governors means we have a number of vacancies which we are actively working to fill.
